STATEMENT ON UNIVERSAL CREDIT UPLIFT CUT

On Wednesday 15th September, Parliament voted against the cut to Universal Credit after the Labour Party used one of its Opposition Day Debate slots to fight the Government's plan to end the Universal Credit uplift. The vote was not binding on the Government. But it was a clear view from Parliamentarians that to remove the £20 uplift in Universal Credit and Working Tax Credit at the end of September, was unfair, would hit local economies hard and push families into poverty. Almost 18,000 households which include 14,500 children across Feltham and Heston are set to lose £1040 next year, taking £18.5m from our local economy. The Joseph Rowntree Foundation has suggested that the withdrawal of the uplift risks bringing 700,000 more people into poverty, including 300,000 children. With the effects of the pandemic still being felt, pulling the rug out from underneath the feet of working people and pushing so many families into poverty is a choice which is wrong, and we will continue to call for an urgent change of course.

BRITISH GURKHA PROTEST

I have been deeply concerned about the pension inequalities faced by British Gurkhas and their repeated ignored request for a channel of dialogue to be opened between themselves and the British Government. I was made aware of the Gurkhas' current protest at Whitehall by the Mayor of Hounslow, Mayor Bishnu Bahadur Gurung. Our constituency has a large Gurkha Nepalese community, and I am aware of the struggles they face and the indignity of being ignored by the government of the country they fought for. I am shocked and concerned by the Government's lack of communication on this issue. In August, I wrote to the Prime Minister to call on him to respond to the concerns of the British Gurkha committee and reminded him of the contributions and sacrifices the Gurkhas have made to Britain. I will continue to follow up the situation closely and will keep in communication with British Gurkha leaders.

As Shadow Minister for Business and Consumers, I recently led on the Ratings Rating (Coronavirus) and Directors Disqualification (Dissolved Companies) Bill which is now in the House of Lords. I will shortly also be taking forward our work on the Subsidies Control Bill which has its second reading in the House of Commons.

I helped launch Labour's five point plan to help tackle the supply chain crisis, calling on the Government to appoint a designated Minister to tackle the issues that go across departments including on driver and skills shortages, before the situation of supply of raw materials and goods hit our local businesses further.

WELLINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY

I was contacted by a constituent following a road traffic accident outside Wellington Primary School on 31st March 2021, which involved a pupil being struck by a motorbike whilst crossing the road. I was deeply concerned about the incident and visited the accident site in front of Wellington Primary School to meet teachers, parents and governors. After hearing the perspectives of the community, I contacted Hounslow Council to communicate the need for a review of the entrances by the school. The consultation process is now complete and based on the rate of progress so far, the crossing should be in place by the end of this year.

I will continue to work with local schools and liaise with Hounslow Council to implement more safety measures so that we can all as a community, ensure that our children remain safe on their way to school.
